4.1 Description of first aid measures

Eye contact

Loosen tight clothing such as a collar, tie, belt or waistband.

Ingestion

: Get medical attention immediately. Call a poison center or physician. Wash out mouth with water. Remove dentures if any. If material has been swallowed and the exposed person is conscious, give small quantities of water to drink. Stop if the exposed person feels sick as vomiting may be dangerous. Do not induce vomiting unless directed to do so by medical personnel. If vomiting occurs, the head should be kept low so that vomit does not enter the lungs. Chemical burns must be treated promptly by a physician. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If unconscious, place in recovery position and get medical attention immediately. 5.2 Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

7.1 Precautions for safe handling

8.2 Exposure controls

Appropriate engineering controls

: Use only with adequate ventilation.
