This is a two component chemically curing aliphatic acrylic polyurethane coating with lasting colour and gloss. The product is recommended as a topcoat for protection in atmospheric environments.

Dry to over coat, minimum: The recommended shortest time before the next coat can be applied.

Dried/cured for service: Minimum time before the coating can be permanently exposed to the intended environment/medium.
